# street psalms

As we enter our new fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, we have much to celebrate. This was a year of fruitfulness and continuing organizational clarity for Street Psalms. We changed our name from Center for Transforming Mission (CTM) to Street Psalms, as we completed the process of spinning off three independent partner organizations incubated under our CTM umbrella. Remaining focused on the heart of what we do, we worked with a marketing consultant to lead us in a rebranding process. We landed with the name that has served our training intensives and spiritual community so well already: "Street Psalms" evokes both the poetry and practicality of the resources we share with urban leaders around the world.

In addition to a new name, we also adopted a new mission statement:

### "Street Psalms is a resource center for life-giving perspectives and practices that foster transformation in vulnerable urban communities."

We revisited our vision and values, and for the first time assembled a complete Case Statement to represent the breadth of Street Psalms' mission and activities.

We hired a co-director, Scott Dewey, as well as a part-time Operations Manager and, beginning July 1, we welcome a full-time Communications Director, Stephanie Dunlap. We retained Five Talents Services to lead us in redeveloping our website into a learning portal that will offer a full library of web-based training and resources. (That website is scheduled for soft launch on June 30 and full completion this fall.)

This increased internal capacity positions us to take full advantage of 21st-century methods, communication, and technology—all the while striving for simplicity—as we offer life-giving practices and perspectives to urban leaders at work in vulnerable communities worldwide.

In this report you'll see the direct expressions and impact of Street Psalms' work this past year. This coming year has us poised on the edge of an exciting idea: working even more closely with our Strategic Partners to create a Training Collaborative that will reach thousands of leaders in dozens of cities globally.

We finish this year with great gratitude for God's abundance and guidance – even in unexpected places and ways. The Spirit ever surprises. Thank you for joining us in our commitment to developing leaders in hard places.

## We continued serving partner organizations and individuals worldwide with our cohort model of training. Street Psalms facilitated six monthly cohorts:

- Organization Directors
- Training Directors
- Community Chaplains
- Spiritual Formation
- Trauma-Informed Empowerment
- Social Enterprise

In addition, we offer local trainings in Tacoma, Washington:

- Weekly lectionary group
- Urban Lecture Series

...and in Denver, Colorado:

- Weekly gatherings for spiritual formation in the Mercy Ministries missional community
- Monthly missional leader gathering

### Our Training Institute outcomes in the past year include:



Leaders trained using Street Psalms curricula in Tacoma, Seattle, Denver, Anchorage, Phoenix; Guatemala City; Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic; Nairobi, Kenya; Marghita, Romania.



Street Psalms allocated \$20,000 in matching capacity building and training grants to four organizations. Match income raised to date is \$62,000.



Churches and communitybased organizations accessed and implemented Street Psalms trainings.

Participants took part in 10 vision trips.




# Street Psalms PUBLICATIONS

## We continue to offer life-giving practices and perspectives through our publishing arm. *Geography of Grace*, published in 2012, has sold 1,221 books. *Meal From Below* (2012) sold 423. We developed two inventory tools to help guide leaders as they assess and address

organizational strengths and weaknesses: an Organizational Capacity Inventory and a Training Hub Inventory. We also developed and led two courses, a "Making Peace with God" course (2013) and a Spiritual Formation Course (2014).

We are committed to working alongside these and other organizations that share in the work of offering life-giving perspectives and practices to leaders worldwide.

On July 1, we are launching a joint initiative of Street Psalms and Leadership Foundations called the Urban Training Collaborative. It will increase the scope and scale of our training. This training collaborative is built around the development of Regional Training Hubs in Guatemala City, Nairobi, Santo Domingo, Delhi, Pretoria, Denver, Minneapolis, and Memphis. Each hub will host a regional formation summit to train leaders to make a difference in vulnerable urban communities. This UTC is supported by a virtual hub hosted by Street Psalms. Thanks to the generosity of our donors and strategic partners, Street Psalms had its most productive year.
